Maintaining a positive, safe environment for every student at Crest Memorial School is the number one priority for teachers and staff. Students may have difficulty settling down when returning to class, respecting other students' space or become too aggressive.

To prevent end-of-the-year excitement from getting out of hand and to make sure all student issues are resolved as efficiently as possible, school officials will be taking the following steps:

- **Student/Parent Concern Form** is available on our web site where parents or students can fill out a brief form. The form can be completed anonymously. When submitted, it alerts school administrators of the issue that they will then investigate. - **Playground rules** have been revised to prevent aggressive behavior from happening.
- **After School Detentions** for grades 4-8 will be held in the library, Monday through Thursday from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. Detentions will be given for patterns of minor offenses or a significant offense (refusal to follow directions, inappropriate language, being disruptive, poor citizenship or cell phone use).
- **Character Education Presentation** emphasizing the importance of good character in school and the community will be provided shortly.

The CMS staff and teachers care deeply for every child in our school community. We have discussed the importance of vigilant supervision and are committed to providing each child the best educational environment possible. Our hope is to work closely with parents to help our students become respectful, responsible individuals who maintain a lifelong love of learning.
